OPCIÓN A

Latin American pope brings joy and debate to Argentina

The man the cardinals chose as pope marks a number of firsts: the first pope named Francis, the first Jesuit pope, the first pope from Latin America.

The choice of a Latin American may be the most significant first. South America has more Catholics than any other continent.

5 Jorge Bergoglio, or Papa Francisco, as he is now known in Spanish-speaking countries, has spent his life in Argentina. He became Archbishop of Buenos Aires in 1998.

10 Around 90 per cent of Argentina's population is considered Catholic but only 10-20 per cent practice their faith. Nevertheless, for Argentines, and for Latin Americans in general, the cardinals' choice has initially been greeted with joy, Viviana Patroni, a Latin America expert at York University told CBC News.

"It's a recognition not only of Latin America but of the need to address the major social problems that Latin America faces in a world that has grown increasingly unequal and unfair," says Argentina-born Patroni, now the coordinator of York's International Development Studies program.

15 Patroni adds that she wishes "the church would become more receptive of the demand for change from all sectors of society, including gay rights and women's rights."

20 Bergoglio has been known for his humility and humble way of life, which included riding the bus to work and cooking his own meals, a far cry from Vatican splendor. Bergoglio even turned down the opportunity to move into the ornate church mansion in Buenos Aires. He's also known for speaking out against poverty.

Argentina's President Cristina Fernandez de Kirchner sent a letter to Pope Francis congratulating him and wishing him "a fruitful task as you take over the immense responsibility of fighting for justice, equality, fraternity and peace for humanity."

25 Fernandez and Bergoglio had frequently clashed over both her government's lack of effectiveness in addressing poverty and on social issues like abortion and same-sex marriage.

Meteor explodes over Russia: No one saw it coming

1 Mother Nature provided a surprise light show over Russia early on February 14. That's
when a major meteor entered Earth's atmosphere. The object was originally 17 meters in
diameter. That's as wide as a 5-story building is high. It had also weighed a whopping
5 10,000 metric tons, according to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration
(NASA).

The meteor was travelling about 65,000 kilometers per hour. It created a brilliant streak
as it travelled across the sky for nearly 33 seconds. The meteor then exploded about 20 to 25
kilometers above Earth's surface.

10 When the meteor exploded, it created a flash brighter than the sun. The explosion released
nearly 500 kilotons of energy. That's about 70 times as much energy as was released just a
few days earlier when North Korea tested a nuclear bomb.

15 NASA maintains an orbital debris office in Texas. It tracks anything that might damage
satellites or knock them out of orbit. Asteroids and other rocky objects sailing through
space are prime candidates. In fact, on the day the Russian meteor hit, NASA and a number
of other space centers around the world had been tracking a very different space rock.
Experts were watching for an asteroid called 2012 DA14, about 50 meters in diameter. It
was due to pass very close to Earth — within 27,000 kilometers — later on the same day.
While the scientists were watching for DA14, the meteor that broke up over Chelyabinsk,
Russia, caught them by surprise.

20 NASA scientists estimate that a meteorite this big hits Earth about once every 100 years.
This was the biggest to hit since a far larger meteorite hit in 1908. It also struck Russia.

Most of the recent meteor disintegrated in the atmosphere. Some fragments certainly
survived the fall to Earth. Usually only about 1 to 5 percent of a meteor's mass is found on
the ground in the form of meteorites, according to the Russian Academy of Sciences.
